

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A: It's hard to tell without seeing the error, but it seems likely that you are using a version of Python that is too old to run the C extensions built against Python 3. For example, this works fine for me with the current CPython 2.7.11: `>>> import ctypes >>> ctypes.CDLL("c:\Python27\python.exe").GetStringType.argtypes = (ctypes.c_char_p,)` So if your Python version is too old, you will need to upgrade.
